- Have sincere interest in the fields of climate finance issues, both locally and globally
- International applicants must possess a passport valid till 31 January 2018

#### Abstract for poster or paper presentation

The submissions of abstracts are to be done through the application form for presenters, provided in the following section. It should contain the overall expectations from the paper or poster. For example, we are accepting posters which cover the vast range of climate finance issues, including local transparency, from the higher-ups to grassroots which directly address climate change adaptation and mitigation.
