

CLIMATE FINANCE TRANSPARENCY MECHANISM (CFTM)

### **CLIMATE FINANCE**

Climate Finance has become a central point in global negotiations. Tracking of climate finance is complex due to overlapping sources, disseminating channels and governance process. In Bangladesh, data on climate finance flow is available but transparency and accountability is still an issue.

**Climate finance** is used to refer to the flow of funds towards mitigation, i.e. activities aimed at reducing GHG emissions; or adaptation, i.e. helping societies to develop resilience in adapting to negative effects of climate change.

### Climate Change Investment/Climate Finance Flow in Bangladesh

#### Climate Change Dedicated Funds

Bangladesh currently has access to four climate change dedicated international funds, which include LDCF (Least Developed Countries Fund) **GEF** Trust Fund (Climate Change Focal Area) **PPCR** (Pilot Programme of Climate Resilience) and GCF (Green Climate Fund). The country also established two climate change dedicated funds including Bangladesh Climate Change Trust Fund (BCCTF) and **Bangladesh Climate Change Resilience Fund** (BCCRF).

Donor Supported Funds through Government Organisations

In Bangladesh, both Climate Finance and Overseas Development Assistance (ODA) are channeled through government organizations; such as, Economic Relations Division (ERD) under the Ministry of Finance of the Government of Bangladesh (GoB) and NGO Affairs Bureau (NGOAB). Apart from the funds flowing in from Climate Change Dedicated Funds (LDCF, GEF, PPCR & GCF), it is unclear whether the funds received for climate change related projects and programmes are Climate Finance or ODA.

NGOAB and ERD are not funding sources. NGOAB is responsible for approving and monitoring the activities and finances of NGOs in Bangladesh. While, ERD is designated for coordinating and mobilizing all external assistance inflows into the country and has developed AIMS database which stores data on all foreign assistance, including funds for climate change, which the country receives.

#### **Domestic Investment on Climate Sensitive Activity**

According to the CPEIR (2012) of the Ministry of Finance, GoB, 1.1% of the GDP was invested on climate sensitive activities. On the other hand, the **Climate Protection and Development Budget** Report (2017) of the Ministry of Finance states that on an average, 0.7% of the GDP was found to be invested in climate sensitive activities in the last four years.

If the entire six years (Fiscal Years 2010/11 to 2015/16) is considered, the total domestic funds from development and climate sensitive activities remains from about US\$ 7 billion to US\$ 11 billion.

### **Fund Focus**

As mentioned above, data on funds received through BCCTF, BCCRF, GEF, PPCR, GCF and LDCF are distinctively climate finance. While the data on funds received through NGOAB and AIMS/ERD are on climate change related projects. This means, it is unclear whether these are climate finance or Overseas Development Assistant (ODA). The funds that are received for climate change related projects are implemented as adaptation project, mitigation project or 'adaptation & mitigation' (AdMit) project.
